“Jack Nelson Wins Trip to Big City Livestock Show”

Jack Nelson of Canton, and a member of the Hustler's 4-H Baby Beef Club for two years, will represent Broadwater County at the National 4-H Club Congress to be held in Chicago at the International Livestock Exposition, Nov. 28 to Dec. 5, 1936. Transportation costs will be furnished Jack through the courtesy of the Milwaukee Railway which has been making a cash contribution for this trip for a number of years. The leaders of this 4-H Hustle's club for the past two years have been William Daniels, Lonnie Merritt, Lawrence Poe and W.E. Spangler.

This trip is very worthwhile as it enables the 4-H club members to meet hundreds of other young folks. They can see a great many educational exhibits and make trips through meat packing plants, The International Harvester Company and other establishments. The young folks are also banquet and luncheon guests of a number of national organizations.

Delegates to this 4-H Congress are selected on their specific achievements in their 4-H club activities and their possibilities of assuming leadership in later life. The score card used this year in Broadwater County included such factors as age (must be 15 or over). Years in 4-H, attitude, interest, number of projects carried, number of final reports received.

Number of final stories received; member demonstration team; member judging team; style revue contestant; number exhibits; number prizes won; other trips or awards; offices held; leader; assistant leader; future leadership possibilities.

4-H club members in Broadwater County may wish to cut out this score card to save for future reference. It is likely that this trip will be continued for a period of years and the club member who will go each year will be determined by what that member does in all his or her 4-H activities.
